### Introductions

Guest Speaker(s): Associate Center Director Verron Brade

- There is a newly created Team looking at the diversity of Ames' pipeline. #### **Public Policy- Sara Jain**

- The House Appropriations Committee released its latest funding bill for FY'21 and the bill would give NASA a total budget of \$22.63 billion for next year, the same amount the agency received in 2020. However, it's nearly \$3 billion less than the \$25.2 billion that the Trump administration called for in the president's budget request.
- NASA Administrator Jim Bridenstine indicated that only \$628.2 million would be allotted for the landers. Bridenstine expressed optimism about the bill. "The \$628.2 million in funding for the human landing system (HLS) is an important first step in this year's appropriations process," Bridenstine said in a statement. "We still have more to do and I look forward to working with the Senate to ensure America has the resources to land the first woman and next man on the Moon in 2024." The Senate Appropriations committee has not marked up any bills so this amount is subject to change.
- The Perseverance rover launched successfully on July 30<sup>th</sup> at 4:50am PDT from the Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida and is expected to land on Mars on February 18, 2021. The target landing site of Perseverance Rover is Jezero Crater. Perseverance will seek signs of ancient life and collect rock and soil samples for possible return to Earth.

#### Safety Outreach- Mike Weiss and Linda McCahon

- Code Q is getting a lot of reports of people not wearing masks and have begun random on the spot audits. It is the expectation of the Center that masks be worn at all times unless you are sitting alone in your office.
